Past
Results

1 Convenience stores and coffee shops were opened on campus.



2 Welfare facilities (cafeterias) were improved on Aobayama, Kawauchi Kita, Katahira, and Seiryō campuses.



3 The Sendai City Transportation Bureau created a new Sanjo-Kawauchi city bus route at the university's request.

4 Based on survey data, a "rainy day" bus and the "Gakuto Sendai City Bus + Subway" free pass were created in cooperation with the Sendai City Transportation Bureau.



5 The maximum length of stay at University House dorms was extended from 1 year to 2 years.

6 In a case study for solving the problem of drinking at student dormitories, the Meizen dormitory was closed and remodeled as an alcohol-free dorm.

7 Center for Career Support hours were extended (until 18:30) so students can use it after classes.



8 The University Counseling Center and all faculties/graduate schools cooperated in implementing harassment prevention training for staff and lectures for students, thus improving our prevention activities.

9 The university will continue to provide information and warnings regarding traffic accidents and cult recruitment activities through the "Gakuseishien Dayori" newsletter.
