## Start of the 64th Seven Universities Athletic Meet Summer Tournament (Nanadaisen)

The 64th Seven Universities Summer Tournament (i.e. the Nanadaisen) is a yearly athletic competition between seven national universities (Hokkaido, Tohoku, Tokyo, Nagoya, Kyoto, Osaka, and Kyushu). It will be hosted by Hokkaido University this year. There will be 39 summer events, starting in June and ending in late September.

On May 27 (Tue.), the Gakuyu-kai's Cheerleading Club held a rally ahead of the tournament. After speeches by the athletes pledging to win in their respective events and achieve overall victory for the university, the Cheerleading Club gave a performance to inspire them and wish them success.

### Softball

The Gakuyu-kai Softball Team aims to sweep the Hokkaido/Tohoku intercollegiate preliminary tournament and win the intercollegiate finals and Nanadaisen.

At the recent Hokkaido/Tohoku Area Spring League, we won all four games earning us a seed in the intercollegiate preliminary. This is a substantial first step towards the national tournament.

This March at the National Public Open in Kato City, Hyogo Prefecture, we placed 5th out of 16 teams, giving us practical experience for the nationals.

At this year's Nanadaisen, games will be held from September 2nd to 5th at the Hamanasu National Memorial Field. A player to watch is 2nd year student Tanaka Ryūji (number 14). As a catcher, he is of course skilled at throwing and blocking, but his speed is also remarkable. As the fastest member of the team, once on base Tanaka's speed makes the opposition's battery pretty much irrelevant.

With this year marking the 20th anniversary of our team's founding, we will take pride in our progress and expend every effort to write a new page in the team's history on the national stage.

If you cannot find it, use the QR code below and enter the relevant information in the Kawauchi Kita Campus Lost Item Form.




### 1 Kawauchi Kita Campus Lost Item Form

Enter the item's distinguishing characteristics in detail to improve your chances of getting it back!

#### Examples

- If you lost a textbook, enter the title and author.
- Describe any notes etc. you've written on/in it.
- If you lost a key, describe the keychain/case color, size, etc.
- If you lost a water bottle, mention the brand, color, shape, etc.
   If you lost clothing, describe the color, fabric, logo, etc.








If your item is found and turned in to the Student Services Division, we will contact you via DC Mail. We recommend you write your name and student number on general items that most students carry,

such as textbooks, notebooks, dictionaries, etc.

## National Pension Plan (Kokumin Nenkin) Special Payment System for Students

All persons age 20 and over living in Japan, including international students, are required by law to enroll in the National Pension System and make payments. However, students with low income (JPY 1.28 million or less for the previous year) can defer



pension payments under the Special Payment System for Students.

You can apply for this system at the Student Services Division, Desk ① (Education and Student Support Center, 1F), the National Pension services desk of the city/ward office where you are registered as a resident, or a nearby National Pension office. You can also apply online through the Myna Portal website.

### What is the Special Payment System for Students?

This is a system for students whose income is below a certain level. It enables deferring National Pension System payments while the student is enrolled. Using this system ensures that students will be able to receive their pensions in the future, and the Disability Basic Pension in the event that they become disabled due to an accident etc.

An application must be made each academic year during which you are enrolled.

- •You can apply at the Student Services Division, Desk ①, even if you did not apply in the previous academic year, and even if your Resident Registration address is not in Sendai.
- Application Form and Procedures
  - You can get an application form at the Student Services Division, Desk ①.
    When applying at the Student Services Division, please bring the following:
    \*Photocopy of your Student ID, or a Certificate of Student Status
    \*Document showing your Social Security and Tax Number (My Number), such as a Basic Pension Number Notice, My Number Card, etc.
- •After applying, you will receive a notice of approval or rejection from the Japan Pension Service. If your application is rejected, you must make pension payments.
