This was probably because the pandemic imposed limits on opportunities for face-to-face communication for several years. Here we will provide a few useful tips on interpersonal communication. If you have any trouble with communication, please feel free to visit the Counseling Office, whatever the issue may be.

(When initiating conversions yourself:) -

- Just say something, even a simple "good morning" or "how are you?"
 Others will not get to hear about your thoughts and ideas if you don't express them, so just talk without worrying about being eloquent.
- If you find the discussion getting too heated, pause the conversation to take a rest. Think about how to express yourself in a way that the other person will readily accept.



[When listening to others:] -

- Listening carefully is the key to being a good listener. As you can imagine, this means listening attentively.
- Have the courage to listen carefully to others, even when you are anxious about not knowing what they might say.
- Try to be respectful, not judgmental, about what others say to you. In communication both you and your conversation partner are important.

At UH, Japanese and foreign students gain an international perspective and deepen their understanding of other cultures by living together and having daily interactions.

It enables students to increase their communication skills, particularly in English.

The living space offers independent units composed of eight private rooms, along with shared showers, toilets, kitchens, and living rooms.

A contractor provides 24-hour/365-day support, and facilities are kept safe and secure by IC card readers on building and unit entrances, as well as password locks on private room doors.


